This work was made in 2008 for the annual Nuit Blanche festival in Paris. It was shot on 16mm and pays tribute to Albert Lamorisse's much-loved short film Le Ballon Rouge (1956). Ratti's works are very often site-specific and respond directly to the context of the exhibition space.

As a red balloon travels around the city of Paris, we see the cityscape shift between the conventional perspective of an earthbound camera and a viewpoint seemingly located inside the balloon itself, as if offering us its perspective on the world. Its journey begins in the Latin Quarter at 9 rue de Condé and ends in the north-east of the city at La Butte Chaumont. The balloon departs from the window of the apartment of the late Félix Guattari, a close friend of the artist, representing a soul wandering through an empty town before disappearing into the sky.

It is not so much a matter of opposing 'monumentality', of presenting direct resistance to whatever threatens us, but I think that in the fragility of things, in what is tiny and ephemeral, in everything that exists and disappears, one can find an antidote, a poetics, a lightness that the forced imposition of self and will and all those great systems only finds with much difficulty or even systematically denies or overwhelms.
