I first met Mr Teo when I was helping my parents rent out their flat at Derbyshire Road. He introduced himself, almost immediately, as both a real estate agent and a spiritual medium. That he could perform both roles simultaneously, and just as professionally. Needless to say, I was intrigued. I asked if he would be interested in interviewing a spirit for me. He said, sure. We negotiated a price for his labour. I requested him to begin right away, and to complete the interview within a month. He said he's seen a spirit hanging around the site of the previous Rochor Centre and that he will attempt to speak to her. I said, that's perfect, a ghost living in the ghost of a building. The following is an edited transcript of the conversation between Mr Teo and the spirit as they speak about architecture, regrets, real estate, travels, and the afterlife.

I can drive you to the airport, he says, you can take the next flight out. Maybe I'll try walking somewhere, she says, that way I can see everything. That's a great idea, he says, you can walk forever. I'll be a wandering ghost, she says. You can walk all the way to China, he says, or even to Europe. I wonder if there are more like you, she says, people who can see us, talk to us. I'm sure there are, he says, I can't be the one with this ability, we have all heard so many stories of people who can talk to ghosts. What are you waiting for, he says. Let's go, she says.
