"Urban environments and imaginary spaces"

Suburbia Contemporary opens in the new space of Barcelona on September 15, 2021. The gallery arrives with its project and its commitment to the visual arts at the Eixample Dreta.

Suburbia Contemporary presents points of radical similarity between different material cultures and artistic traditions from across the globe. Born in 2017 in Granada with the imperative of gathering artists from a variety of cultural backgrounds and geographical locations within a single cluster, the gallery launched Satellite spaces in Cape Town (2019) and Florence (2020), structuring contact between the East, West, North and South through a consistently evolving, critically engaged exhibition program open to antique and traditional knowledge systems, secret, hidden languages and future definitions of craft and artistic practice.

With its arrival in Barcelona, Suburbia will begin with a new program curated by the visual artist Mabel Palacín, focused on local talent, supporting young artists and new contemporary artistic practices with meetings and exhibitions.
