Zabriskie Point presents a group of artists that utilize familiar objects or images and re-present them with unusual physical or conceptual components. Much like Antonioni's 1970 film, "Zabriskie Point," these works incorporate formal elements that are suspended amongst strong narrative glimpses and memories. The stories that punctuate Antonioni's film are placed within a context of surreality in a way that creates a sense of displacement. This exhibition brings together artists that are exploring similar ideas across a variety of media and techniques.

Sarah Braman was born in Tonawanda, NY, and lives and works in Amherst, MA and New York, NY. She received her MFA from Tyler School of Art, Philadelphia, PA, in 1998 and her BFA from Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore, MD, in 1992. Braman is one of the founders of artist-run Canada, in New York. In 2013, she was the recipient of the Maud Morgan Prize from MFA, Boston.
