Dreamers Awake 28 June - 17 September 2017

White Cube presents 'Dreamers Awake', a major exhibition exploring the enduring influence of Surrealism through the work of more than 50 women artists.

This group show brings together more than 180 works from the 1930s to the present day to explore sexual politics, eroticism, mysticism and identity.

From its earliest days, women artists have been drawn to Surrealism's emphasis on artistic freedom and unlocking the creative potential of the unconscious. By focusing on the work of a selection of women artists, 'Dreamers Awake' shows how the symbolic 'woman' – synonymous with Surrealism – is refigured as a creative, sentient, thinking being.

The exhibition features works by artists associated with the Surrealist movement – including **Eileen Agar**, **Leonora Carrington**, **Lee Miller**, **Dorothea Tanning** and **Leonor Fini** – who until recently, were characterised as muses, models or mistresses.

Photography, film, sculptures and installations by Francesca Woodman, Hannah Wilke, Louise Bourgeois, Rosemarie Trockel, Kiki Smith, Paloma Varga Weisz, Mona Hatoum, Tracey Emin and Sarah Lucas, among others, testify to the far-reaching influence of Surrealism through the intervening decades.

Also in the exhibition, Surrealism meets punk in the work of **Linder**, and infuses the separate cultural heritages of Iraqi artist **Hayv Kahraman** and Japanese painter **Tomoko Kashiki**.

Presenting new works by emerging international artists **Sascha Braunig**, **Jordan Kasey**, **Loie Hollowell**, **Kelly Akashi**, and **Caitlin Keogh**, the exhibition explores the continued relevance of Surrealist ideas to a new generation.

'Dreamers Awake' runs across all galleries at White Cube Bermondsey from 28 June to 17 September 2017. It is accompanied by a fully illustrated catalogue with essays by the exhibition curator Susanna Greeves, and art historian Dr Alyce Mahon, author of *Eroticism and Art* (2005, 2007) and *Surrealism and the Politics of Eros, 1938-1968* (2005).
